# FLOWER POLICY - Approved January 10, 1961

The Tippecanoe Amateur Radio Association will send a potted plant to the member of the Association who has had a death in his immediate family or same household. Immediate family shall be defined as: a mother, father, brother, sister, husband, wife, children, mother-in-law, or father-in-law.
