T.A.R.A. Business Meeting Tuesday September 13, 1994

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM by Jeff Stewart, KF9UP.

Treasurer, Jack Freeman - KF9CT, reported on financial activity for the month, including the Hamfest outcome. See the Treasurer's Report for details. It was moved (Bob Martin) and seconded (Charlie Williams) to accept the report. Motion passed.

Bruce Stewart, N9GKE, gave a short report on the Hamfest. He stated there were no major problems or complaints. Bruce has also volunteered to be Hamfest Chairman for next year. If you attend a lot of other hamfests, please contact Bruce about getting some flyers and discount tickets to take along to help publicize our upcoming Hamfest. He would like to get much more publicity for next year. Jack Ott, K9AHX, and Brad Lovett, KD9SF, have volunteered to help with publicity. We may also have a new barn available for the Hamfest, though it may be more expensive.

Bob Martin, W7YE, commented on VE testing. We were paid for 11 test sesions with 16 total test given. The Club collected \$63.25 of which \$19.25 has been forwarded to the ARRL VEC. A card received from the ARRL verified that the forms were proper and complete.

Ed Delp was a guest and introduced himself to the Club. He was a ham several years ago and is now returning to the hobby. Jeff Stewart also reported that Brady Mart, N9YAW, was interested in joining the Club but couldn't attend the meeting since he worked second shift.

A motion was made (Jim Collison) and seconded (Curtis Sherwin) to accept them as new members. Motion passed.

A new member, Bob Lusby - K9FOH, introduced himself. He is interested in QRP and 6 meters and will be joining the VE team as an Extra Class examineer.

The Feast of the Hunter's Moon is on Oct 1 and 2. People are needed to help direct traffic. Emergency Management will be handling the busiest intersections and have asked us to help them with other traffic control. Since the police and sheriff's department may be busy else where, they're looking for as many people to help as we can round up, especially on Saturday. Jim Collison and Dave Azpell report that it's not a difficult job. Mostly keep traffic headed the right direction and provide communications between the parking areas. Jack Freeman has volunteered to paint the bottom part of the tower here at the Red Cross building. Other volunteers are requested. Hopefully, there will be a date and time published somewhere in this month's newsletter.

In this month's drawing, Dick Collison's name was chosen. Since Dick wasn't in attendance, next month's drawing will be for \$18.

The meeting was then adjourned.
