T.A.R.A Business Meeting Tuesday, 14 February, 1995

The meeting was called to order at 1932 hrs by president Jeff Stewart, KF9UP.

Reports

Tim Easterday, N9ZLNQ, introduced himself as a guest and indicated he was interested in joining the club. KF9UP also stated that Ed Stickrod, N9DJK, who was not present, was interested in joining the club. It was moved and seconded that these individuals be accepted as members. The motion passed.

The minutes from the January 10, 1995 meeting were read by secretary Tim Gennett, KF9WX. There being no corrections the minutes were approved as read. It was suggested that minutes not be read at future meetings as all club members receive a copy of the minutes in the *TARA Tattler*.

Treasurer Jack Freeman, KF9CT, reported a balance of \$12,981.96 for all club accounts and provided a summary of recent financial transactions. He also reported that the VE testing team had generated revenues of \$213.95 to date with expenses of \$215.95 to date. His report was accepted as read.

KF9WX reported that seven candidates had tested at the last VE testing session. Three candidates qualified for a new license.

Old Business

Bob Finch, N6CXB, thanked Curtis Sherwin, WB9SWD, and Kevin Craw, KA9VXS, for their assistance with the hard line project. They recently secured approximately 500 feet of 3/4" hard line courtesy of Dimension Cable. More may be available in the future. There should be enough hard line in the appropriate lengths to replace the existing hard line on the tower when necessary.

New Business

Bob Lusby, K9FOH, asked a question about club assets and what might be available or could be made available for portable and/or emergency operations. Extensive discussion followed, eventually focusing on the long term need of the club for a permanent club station. It was pointed out that the club at one time had a building fund with the goal of purchasing property for such a station; the club subsequently decided to make a significant donation to the building fund of the Tippecanoe County Chapter of the American Red Cross in return for the space currently occupied by the club in the Chapter House. It was eventually decided to form a committee to study the property acquisition issue. Those volunteering to serve on the committee include K9FOH; WB9SWD, Jim Canarecci, WA9TGO; and Tom Melville, N9YTB. The question of insurance for club equipment was also raised. KF9CT will investigate and report.

N9GKE presented a receipt for \$99.96 for two portable cookers purchased for use during the hamfest. It was moved and seconded that he be reimbursed. The motion passed.

Announcements

Bob Niewerth, KC9LI, reminded the club the W9REG station license would expire in September and plans for renewal should be made.

Mark Conner, N9XTN, announced he would be attending a day-long, advanced weather spotting class in DuPage County, Illinois, on Saturday, March 4. He may have space in his vehicle for others wishing to attend. There is a \$20 fee for the course.

Testees for new amateur licenses in Logansport the second weekend in January made history by being among the first to have their applications filed electronically with the FCC. New licenses were granted within days rather than weeks under the previous system.

Electronic filing consists of transmitting two data files over telephone lines from VEC's PC directly into the FCC's computer. One file contains examination records and the other file has the associated Form 610 applications. The information from each local testing session is transmitted via MCI Mail to the W5YI-VEC, according to local testing coordinator, Bill Wells, W8HSU.

"This makes it very important that the information is accurate," Wells said. "Any errors can slow down the process and delay a new licensee from getting his call letters."

Once received at the W5YI-VEC, the files are screened for obvious errors, appended to files from other testing sessions, and transmitted to the FCC. Call signs are normally issued within a day or two. Applicants still receive a printed license but they may begin operating once the call sign is issued, before receiving a license.

Since the W5YI-VEC and the ARRL-VEC account for 85% of all amateur licenses, they were selected to be first to participate in this latest development. Although electronic filing is not a requirement, most exam teams have elected to utilize this advantage.

Testees during the January testing session were joined in the initial electronic filing with counterparts in Bucksport, ME, Chesapeake, VA, Sheffield, AL, Radcliff, KY, Jefferson, NC, Reno, NV, Findlay, OH, and Nitro, WV. Following test sessions January 13 and 14, applicants began receiving call signs by the 18th. It might have been even quicker but that week contained a Federal holiday! (Some info from W5YI Report.)
