# Tippecanoe Amateur Radio Association Business Meeting Tuesday, 13 February, 1996

The meeting was called to order at 1930 hrs EST by president Bob Martin, W7YE. Those present included W9BZF, KF9CT, N9GKE, N9JEA, WD9JLN, KB9KUQ, W9NSY, WB9SWD, KF9UP, N9VLW, KF9WX, N9XPZ, N9XTL, W7YE, N9YTE, WB6YLL.

## Reports

The minutes from the previous meeting were approved as published.

Treasurer Jim Canarecci, WA9TGO, provided a summary or recent financial transactions. The balance of all club accounts is \$13,865.30. A complete report will be published in the next edition of the *Tattler*.

W7YE reported on a meeting of the executive committee which had been held just previous to the business meeting. See minutes which follow. The was an error in previous announcements concerning membership of two different antenna committees. The standing committee charged with responsibility for the antennas at the Red Cross is chaired by Dave Azpell, WB9CZC, and also includes Dick Collison, WD9CJS, and Curtis Sherwin, WB9SWD. The Field Day antenna committee includes Bob Finch, N6CXB, Dave Roberts, KE9IT, and WB9SWD.

Ed Delp, N9YTE, has agreed to be the chair of the program committee. He will begin with the March program meeting. W7YE will show a videotape at the next program meeting, February 28, on a 1990 Dxpedition to Curacao.

W7YE reported on a program from Buckmaster, which is trying to collect group and individual photos for inclusion in future CD ROM's. For each 10 such photos submitted by TARA, Buckmaster will donate one CD to the club. N9YTE will take photos at April meetings

Brenda Williams, N9XTL, reported the Indiana Veteran's Home has again offered to host Field Day activities.

Jack Freeman, KF9CT and Bruce Stewart, N9GKE reported on repairs to the generator. They have located a source for a parts manual, which will cost \$60.75. Still looking for a wiring schematic, which may cost that much again. The generator was manufactured for the military in 1968. The generator does not have electric start. Charlie Williams, N9VLW, will investigate other sources for documentation. There was considerable debate on whether to repair this generator, buy a new one, or continue to borrow generators for Field Day. It was finally concluded that additional investigation will be made by KF9CT to try to determine the cost to restore to working condition.

### **New Business**

Tim Gennett, KF9WX, moved that TARA join AMSAT at a cost of \$30 and make an additional cash donation of \$220 to support the construction and launch of the Phase 3-D satellite. The motion was seconded by N9YTE. The motion passed.

WA9TGO presented a request from N6CXB for reimbursement for \$7.52 to cover repair parts to the Drake tuner. The request was approved.

### Announcements :

WB9CZC announced that the Red Cross would be installing a fire and security alarm system. TARA members having keys to the building may need to exchange their keys and will also need to obtain a security code to enter the building.

Jeff Stewart, KF9UP, announced that W9YB (Purdue Amateur Club) is planning a fox hunt for the end of March.

J. B. VanSickle, K9KRE, announced that Gary Howard is home from the hospital and doing well.

The drawing was held for the attendance prize. Hubert Wood, N7DUK was drawn. As he was not in attendance the drawing for the March business meeting will be for \$18.

There being no other business, it was moved and seconded that the meeting be adjourned. The motion passed and the meeting was adjourned at 2013 hrs EST.

# Tippecanoe Amateur Radio Association Executive Committee Meeting Tuesday, 13 February, 1996

The meeting was called to order by president Bob Martin, W7YE, at 1845 hrs EST.

He presented a list of possible objectives for TARA. He has appointed a steering committee to review these ideas and generate recommendations to direct the future growth of the club. That committee will be chaired by Jeff Stewart, KF9UP, and will include Dave Roberts, KE9IT, Bob Finch, N6CXB, and Bob Losby, K9FOH.

The executive committee discussed the prospect of donating money to AMSAT to support the launch of the Phase 3D satellite. W7YE called AMSAT and learned that the total cost of the project was estimated at \$5 million and would be paid for by hams around the world. The launch alone will cost \$1.5 million. AMSAT has pledged \$300,000 to the project, \$200,000 of which has already been raised, but it must still raise an additional \$100,000. The satellite is the most ambitious amateur satellite project to date. It will be multiband, multimode, high power, high apogee, and open to use by any licensed amateur, including Technicians. Matching funds are no longer available from the ARRL. It should be possible to work the satellite without major investments in equipment. The committee agreed to make a recommendation to the full membership to have TARA join AMSAT and make an additional cash donation for a grand total of \$250.

Membership of the two antenna committees was discussed. There was some confusion last month as to who was on what committee. The club's standing committee will be chaired by Dave Azpell, WB9CZC, and will include vice president Curtis Sherwin, WB9SWD, and Dick Collison, WD9CJS. The Field Day antenna committee will include WB9SWD, Dave Roberts, KE9IT, and Bob Finch, N6CXB.

Ed Delp, N9YTE, was present and agreed to chair the program committee beginning with the March program. W7YE will show an hour and ten minute long video tape at the February program meeting on a 1990 Finnish Dxpedition to Curacao. Budget for that expedition was over \$1 Million.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned at 1915 hrs EST.

# **Tippecanoe County Warning Sirens**

There are currently 28 warning sirens located in Tippecanoe County as indicated in the box to the right. These sirens can be used to alert the public to a wide range of threatening conditions or disasters. This includes events like severe weather, tornadoes, flash floods, and chemical spills. The Tippecanoe County Emergency Management Agency, TEMA, is in charge of setting off those sirens in the case of such an emergency.

TEMA performs siren tests once a month, on the first Saturday of the month, at 11:00am (unless there is severe weather in the area). These siren tests are a way to 1) inform the public of how the sirens might be used in an emergency, and 2) check that the sirens are functioning properly.

To assure that each siren is functioning properly, TEMA collects reports on siren operation. These reports come from TEMA volunteers, amateur radio operators and through telephone calls to some of the sites.

In addition to the sirens already installed, 9 new sirens have been purchased and will be installed soon. The additional sirens will provide better coverage within the county, but will make it more difficult to cover the sirens during tests. That's where you come in; you could help check out a siren.

If you're available to check out a siren, get on the radio the morning of a test. Sometime after 10:30am, someone from TEMA should be available on the WIRES repeater. If you have a siren you'd like to check, let them know. Otherwise, they can assign you a siren to check. By checking in ahead of time, they can avoid having multiple people checking the same siren and get the maximum benefit from those helping.

In order to identify a non-working siren, it is very important that siren reports correctly identify the siren being heard. You don't need to be sitting directly under the siren (that'll hurt your ears), but you should be close enough to be sure you hear the siren you're reporting and not some other siren in the distance. After the sirens have been set off, make your report to the TEMA representative and by 11:05 you'll be on your way knowing you've helped the community.


