Net Control Openings Possible

A few positions as Net control Operators may come available in the near future with the Dayton Section of SKYWARN. Amateurs interested in becoming a Net Control Operator must meet the following requirements.

- 1. Hold a valid FCC Amateur Radio License of no-code technician class or higher and must be 21 years old.
- 2. Live within 10-15 minutes driving distance of the Dayton SKYWARN operating location.
- 3. Acquire a pager and pay all operating costs.
- 4. Pager must be on 24 hours a day from March 1 to November 30 except when out of area.
- 5. Applicant must be willing to have his/her home life disrupted at a moment's notice and reliable respond to the SKYWARN location.
- 6. Prior net control experience is preferred or applicant must demonstrate the ability to conduct SKYWARN type net operations.
- 7. Must be able to follow established operating practices set forth in the SKYWARN constitution and accept verbal directions from the Steering committee and National Weather Service.

In addition, the applicant must be interviewed by the Steering Committee and meet additional criteria set forth in the Dayton Sections SKYWARN Constitution.
