T.A.R.A. Business Meeting Tuesday, 09 July, 1996

The meeting was called to order at 1930 hrs EST by president Bob Martin, W7YE. Those present included K9AHX, N6CXB, N9DHH, N9GKE, WA9HKK, KB9JDA, KB9KUQ, KC9LI, WA9LYC, W9NSY, N9RRQ, WB9SWD, WA9TGO, KF9UP, KF9WX, W7YE, KB9KNR, and WA9CGH.

Reports

As the minutes from the last meeting were not available, approval was deferred to the August meeting.

Treasurer Jim Canarecci, WA9TGO, read the treasurer's report. The club has a balance in all accounts of \$12,235.62. A complete report will appear in the next edition of the *Tattler*. It was moved and seconded that his report be approved as read. The motion passed.

Old Business

W7YE announced that one of the power supplies purchased for Field Day has a bad voltage meter. Astron has promised to send a replacement but it has not yet been received.

Jeff Stewart, KF9UP, provided a summary of Field Day scoring. There were 502 CW contacts, 470 HF SSB contacts, 60 HF Novice contacts, six 6 Meter contacts and 54 2 Meter contacts for a total of 1092 contacts and 3988 points, including bonus points. This compared to 1208 contacts and 4592 points in 1995. He still needs a copy of the W1AW bulletin to complete the entry.

WA9TGO inquired as to the status of antenna repairs at the Red Cross. Curtis Sherwin, WB9SWD, advised that repairs had been deferred until after Field Day.

W7YE reported on the disposition of the two club trailers, including the new trailer donated by Emergency Management. KF9UP and WB9SWD are each storing a trailer.

W7YE asked the secretary to write thank you letters to the Commandant of the Veteran' Home and to the Army Reserve.

N6CXB inquired as to the status of the letter to be written to Cox Communications concerning the donation of reel ends. The secretary indicated a letter would be written.

New Business

Bruce Stewart, N9GKE, reported on preparations for the Lafayette Hamfest. He plans to start set-up on 17 August at 1 pm and will need volunteers to help. The ARRL will donate some prizes but TARA will need to purchase a major prize if one is to be awarded. After discussion it was decided to award a 2 Meter HT as a major prize. It was also moved and seconded to advance N9GKE \$150 to pay for Hamfest publicity. The motion passed.

Jack Ott, K9LHX, introduced a motion to have the club buy a Yeasu 736R plus various accessories. The motion was seconded. After discussion a vote was taken and the motion was defeated.

Steve Stombaugh, N9DHH, asked if there was interest in renting a bus to attend the Dayton Hamvention on Saturday. After discussion he concluded there was sufficient interest for him to make a formal proposal at the next meeting.

N9DHH also announced that WLF1 was erecting a new tower and would not allow the WIRES repeater to relocate to the new tower. Unless an alternative site can be found WIRES will be off the air effective September 1.

WGLM has offered their tower as a replacement site but moving the repeater farther north may cause increased interference from Chicago stations. He asked that anyone having any suggestions for a new location contact him.

Shelby Burkhardt, N9SCG, was unable to be present but asked to be elected as a member. It was moved and seconded that he be elected. The motion passed.

The attendance drawing was held for the \$12.00 prize. Dave Moffett, N9SBZ was drawn. As he was not in attendance the August drawing will be for \$18.00.

There being no other business it was moved and seconded that the meeting be adjourned. The motion passed and the meeting adjourned at 2032 hrs EST.

Field Day 1996 Report (continued)

This year the Field Day site was once again located on the bluff at the Indiana Veteran's Home on North River Road, in West Lafayette, IN. The grounds provide an ample number of trees to support several wire antennae including a large horizontal loop. It's also a public location which generates a 100 point bonus.

Those who spent Friday night at the site were rewarded for their efforts on Saturday morning with a cold shower and running water (plus a little thunder and lightning for good measure). Otherwise, Mother Nature smiled on us in providing a very nice weekend for our activities.

Setup started on Friday afternoon and ran into the evening. Most of the time was devoted to getting equipment delivered to the site and putting antenna support lines into trees. Curtis the Archer, WB9SWD, shot a lot of arrows into the trees. Unfortunately, not many successfully resulted in usable support lines as the fishing line was too light weight. After obtaining 30-40 pound test line, things went along much smoother. Setup continued on Saturday morning with additional antenna work. Radios were delivered and installed as power and feed-line was provided.

This year, the two HF operating positions were both located in trailers — the TARA trailer was used for phone operations and a trailer provided by Emergency Management housed the CW station. Emergency Management has offered TARA the use of the trailer whenever it's needed and given us permission to modify the trailer layout to fit our needs.

Charles Williams, N9VLW, obtained a large squad tent which was used as a general shelter area and gathering place. This worked out very nicely and would be great to have again.

Tim, KF9WX, furnished his Kenwood rig for CW again this year and Jeff, KF9UP, provided his Ten-Tec for the phone operation. The Club's Jammer was used for phone, and the Club's packet, Yaesu all-mode and newly purchased brick amplifiers were used for UHF/VHF operations.

Jack Freeman, KF9CT, and a couple others (WB9SGP? and/or WB9CZC?) supplied gasoline powered generators which delivered power for all the operations. Curtis, WB9SWD, supplied a deep cycle battery charged from solar cells to provide power for some of the CW contacts so we would qualify for the "Natural Power" bonus.

Failure to make any packet contacts this year was due, at least in part, to problems with the W9YB packet system. VHF also suffered from problems with bad PL259 connectors, the lack of a 440 Mhz radio capable of running side band, and some mis-communications that resulted in the Satellite station being torn down before the last satellite pass. However, sixty VHF contacts were

made to add to the total QSO count.

The CW station shut down about 90 minutes before the end of the contest when the computer batteries ran out after generator power had been removed.

Computers, loaned to us by Bob, W7YE, were used for logging during the competition using the software logging program "CT" by Ken Wolf, K1EA. Some problems occurred when one of the log files was incorrectly set up requiring a work-around and some manipulation of the final log files.

Bruce, N9GKE, once again volunteered his wife, Kathy, to help with the Saturday evening meal. They did a great job, preparing thick steaks, corn on the cob, potatoes (au gratin?), and providing a variety of drinks. Several desserts were also available, provided by assorted Club members (or their spouses). Sunday morning, Jim, K9LYA, once again supplied biscuits and sausage gravy and Tim, KF9WX, brought some decadent cinnamon rolls.

A visitor's log and sign-up sheet was located at the TARA trailer, but I know there were some names missing so I added those I know I'd seen. Hopefully, I didn't miss too many.

Operations ended Sunday at 13:00 with over 1000 contacts having been made.
