No squelching action and full volume, not controllable by the volume control, shorted 12AT7 1st audio & squelch tube.

Things were simple, and average repair time was under 15 minutes. Now their are fewer outages, but much longer repair times. Sometimes I think the total maintenance time per radio is about the same, and where it was a problem you had seen before in the 50's, now in the 90's, it always something different.

Then the solid state receivers came along, followed shortly by transmitters. Motorola's first attempt had 6 transistors in the final, and 18, really 18, transistors to protect those 6, sort of creating a cascading effect. You had a hard time getting the thing on, so you could figure out where the problem was. (NO SMOKE)

We once made a service call (Purdue Veterinary Service) where the complaint was that their radio did not work. For some strange reason the Remote Console sat backward on the desk, and the system was shut down at night, and back on the morning. They missed one night, or morning, so after turning the console on for them, I asked "What else is wrong?"
