To Renew Your How License

(Transcribed from the original script of a report for Amateur News Weekly of December 15, 1996)

I got a couple of letters the other day from a VEC group. Seems my license (and the license for the club for whom I'm trustee) is expiring The VEC group very kindly enclosed some 610's and in 90 or so days. offered to renew both licenses for the paltry sum of \$6 apiece. The letter was very official looking. Both the VEC group and FCC logos were on the letterhead, and halfway down the page in big bold print was the statement:
YOU NEED TO RENEW YOUR LICENSE NOW!

This is the only notification you will receive from us.

It's a very attention grabbing notice. There are only two small problems here. #1, they sent me the wrong form for a club license renewal - that takes a FCC for 610-b, not a standard 610. #2, amateur radio licenses can be renewed for the cost of an envelope, the price of a stamp, and the energy it takes to dial a 1-800 number - and that sure comes to a lot less than six bucks.

First, the forms are available direct from the FCC. You can call and have the forms in question (a standard 610, a 610-bravo for club licenses, or a 610-victor for vanity calls) sent to you, by dialing 1-800-418-3676 from a touchtone phone and following the menu on the voice mail. (This number is the FCC Forms Distribution Center - calling can get you just about any FCC form by mail, or by fax if you're so equipped.) addition, you can get 610's and 610-bravos (not 610-victors for vanity calls) from the VEC Department at ARRL HQ - just call 1-800-594-0300. You do not have to be a league member to request these forms. (we'll run all these phone numbers again9n later, so you can grab a pencil.)

Okay, you've got the forms in your hot little hands and have them filled out properly. Naturally, you've triple-checked everything for accuracy, stuffed the envelope plied a stamp, and are now scratching your head wondering where to send them.

You can send all the various forms to the FCC, 1270 Fairfield Rd., Gettysburg, PA 17325. Or, if you're a league member, you can send form 610 only (they don't handle vanity calls or club licenses) to league HQ in Newington, attention VEC Department. The league will electronically file the 610, which may actually be faster than waiting until the FCC gets down the stack of incoming mail to your envelope.

So, let's run down all those phone numbers again. To order any FCC form, call the FCC Forms Distribution Center at 1-800-418-3676 from a touchtone phone and follow the voice mail menu. To order FCC forms 610 and 610-bravo from the ARRL, call the VEC Department Monday thru Friday 8am to 5pm eastern time at 1-800-594-0300.

Any way you look at it, it's a lot cheaper to renew your license yourself. I'm going to take some of the money I saved and send that VEC group in question a QSL card thanking them for the forms and their concern. Then I'll probably take the rest of the money and have a cold one.

My thanks to Marcella Florence in the VEC Department at American Radio Relay League Headquarters for her assistance in preparing this report.

Recollections of Ken Adams, KB9BJW (compiled by Steve Belter, WB9SGP, with help from several of Ken's ham friends)

I met Ken about 25 years ago at the Computing Center. He had quite a reputation then, both for his software skills and for the condition of his office: in particular, the stacks of computer listings from floor to ceiling, with just a narrow path to his chair.

Ken enjoyed flying radio-controlled model airplanes. As a outgrowth of this hobby, he passed the Novice exam in August, 1988, and received his Technician-Plus license in November 1989.

He quickly became involved with the public service aspects of our hobby. When the amateur radio position of Tippecanoe County Emergency Coordinator needed filling, Ken volunteered.

He did a first class job, enlisting the help of a half dozen of us as assistants, arranging training and drills, filing the paperwork with the ARRL, and facilitating cooperation between hams and TEMA (Tippecanoe Emergency Management Agency).

In addition to coordinating the hams, he also volunteered with TEMA, frequently assisting with storm spotting when severe weather was predicted. A couple of days after the tornado struck in West Lafayette, Ken delivered a detailed map and report tracing the path of the tornado and documenting the damage to Steve Wettschurack at TEMA.

Like many hams, Ken collected radios. Unlike most however, instead of selling the radios he no longer used, he loaned them to friends and to Emergency Management. Dave Azpell, WB9CZC, reports that Ken has radios all over the county.

Jack Ott, K9AHX, wrote: "I still have one of Ken's airplanes hanging here in my Playhouse. He flew radio-controlled sailplanes mostly. Ken was so busy and involved in so many things I never got to spend as much time with him as I would have liked to."

"He gave money to the Women's Volleyball and Basketball programs and went to many of them. He took me to one of the Basketball games four years ago and I have been to all of them since."

Dave Roberts, KE9IT, wrote: "I often met Ken for breakfast. We talked about many things, ham radio, bees, computers, telecommunications and work."

"Ken was a keeper of bees and had hives all over central Indiana, over a hundred, which were left at locations allowing the bees to pollinate plants in the vicinity. Folks in the country realize the importance of this offering. Ken of course harvested the honey and gave most of it to friends or people he knew in need of a little nourishment. He would spend the winters building bee super structures to be placed in the field the next spring."

"Ken often spoke of amateur radio and groups like Tipp Co Emergency Management, Red Cross, etc., and how we as volunteers could assist in their efforts. Ken was well known for his ability to carefully analyze a situation and tastefully offer a solution to the groups involved."

"I am very sorry to learn of another SK among our ranks; Ken certainly did much for us. That effort, for the most part, went unnoticed by many of us. Ken didn't want to be noticed for his efforts; he was most interested in just getting the job done well."

Ken was usually represented at the Field Day auction: donating jars of honey to be auctioned off, and buying the miscellaneous gadget. This last year, Bruce Stewart, N9GKE, "purchased" (through the generosity of his friends) a boat anchor. Much to Bruce's disappointment, Ken delivered the 40-pound transformer to Bruce's front porch.

Ken's bee keeping activities kept him busy, and provided a little comic relief on more than one occasion. He would transport the bees in the back of his van, which would make a sudden stop in traffic far more exciting than normal, tipping over the hives and upsetting the bees. I wasn't listening, but there's a story about Ken talking on a repeater while driving to the emergency room after such a stop, his conversation punctuated by "ooch" and "ouch".

Tippecanoe County's siren tests usually found Ken as an active participant. One Saturday morning he overslept, but nonetheless reported that the siren behind his house was working. In fact, it worked so well that the bees started swarming, and Ken couldn't have left the house if he wanted to. On the Saturday before he died, Ken called in to report that he could hear the sirens from his bed at Saint E's.

Thanks for everything Ken.
