Minutes of the TARA business meeting June 8, 1999

The minutes were taken by KB9JDE, due to the absence of Secretary KE9OV.

President WB9SWD called the meeting to order at 1932 hours.

Minutes

Minutes from the May meeting were not available.

Treasurer's Report

Field Day Auction took in \$330.25. Money was given to K9KRE to cover postage and printing costs of the Tattler.

WB9BRX noted that the annual invoice for the club's liability insurance is due. It was the general consensus that a vote to approve payment was unnecessary, and that the invoice should be paid.

The portable toilet for Field Day has been prepaid and will be set up several days before we arrive at the site. This allowed the club to save some expense, as the rental company was able to deliver it on their regular delivery run and not have to schedule a special trip specifically for us. W9YA moved to approve the payment, W9YE seconded. Motion passed.

Old Business

W9YA noted that he did not buy new rope at Dayton because his usual vendor was not present. He also did not receive an advance payment, so no refund is due.

We have officially received permission to use the Veterans Home for Field Day again this year. KF9CT has sent a letter to the Home inviting staff and residents to visit us during the event.

New Business

Field Day is June 26-27.

TEMA will again provide the big generator and command trailer for our use at no cost to us.

KB9KUQ reiterated that TARA must request permission before making modifications to TEMA (or anyone's) property.

Much discussion followed regarding the requirement for an air conditioner for the CW shack. Some people want to modify the TEMA trailer to accept a small window air conditioner, similar to the unit that was provided last year. KB9KUQ suggested that two club members speak with TEMA officials and request permission make the necessary modifications. W9YE volunteered to accompany KB9KUQ for this purpose.

The long heavy cables that we typically use to run from the generator to the shacks have been donated to TEMA with the understanding that TARA shall have access to them. The cables now remain with the generator.

W9YE suggested that TARA should consider purchasing our own generator. General consensus was that we should wait until next year, when an abundance of generators are expected to be on the market.

KF9CT will supply a backup generator (useful as a backup in case of a failure to the big unit, but can also be used to provide power when the big unit requires refueling).

KB9KUQ will take care of all electrical supply and electrical grounding.

W9YA noted that he wants ground rods in the HF shacks in order to ground the antennas in the event of stormy weather. These grounds shall not be connected to the trailer frame or electrical supply. A general discussion on various grounding issues (RF &

electrical ensued).

KF9CT will bring three grounds rods for our use.

Field Day Jobs

Media: K9WX will issue a press release to the media, similar to what he has done the past several years. He will be out of town during Field Day (and the week prior). He suggests that someone make contact with the media a few days before the big event.

Electrical: As previously noted, KB9KUQ will handle the electrical systems.

Antennas: In general, the plans are to do pretty much the same as in the past few years. WB9NIF, KF9CT & W9YA will visit the site before FD and make some preliminary plans for the overall layout.

Signs: KB9KUQ suggested that we label each operating position in terms that the public would likely understand.

Co-ordinators: WB9NIF will act as co-ordinator for setup and operations. KB9JDE will co-ordinate the chase for bonus points. [This is something we haven't tried before. Please contact WB9NIF either before FD or when you arrive on site. He will put together a schedule for all operators in an attempt to make sure that everyone has a chance to operate the stations].

Rigs:

W9YE will provide a Yeasu FT920 for the CW shack, and an Icom IC821 for the satellite station. Note: To protect his property, he specifically requests that we not keep all smoking materials and drinks away from his radios.

N9ZFG will provide a Yeasu FT847 for the VHF/UHF station. KB9JDE will bring a backup rig.

KB9JDA will provide both an HF and a 10m rig for the Novice station.

General Discussion

There is some disagreement about the rules regarding simultaneous operation of the satellite station and the VHF/UHF station. Careful reading of the rules reveals an ambiguity. KF9UP will contact ARRL for a clarification.

The question of whether FD is an emergency preparedness exercise or a operating contest was raised by WB9NIF. After a short discussion, it was agreed that while it has aspects of both, when the two objectives conflict, the exercise takes precedence.

It was noted that the ARRL is (for the first time) offering Field Day pins to participants. The cost is five dollars each. The League suggests that Club groups send a single order.

Computers for logging will be provided by KF9UP, KB9JDE, WB9SWD and perhaps others. After some discussion, it was agreed that we will use "TR" for all logging. WB9NIF will secure the software. On Wednesday, June 23 (what would normally be the club program meeting night) we will gather at the club shack to set up the computers and provide TR training for anyone interested.

The idea of the club purchasing a screen canopy (basically a dining fly with screen walls) was raised by KB9JDE. After some discussion, no motion was put forth.

The drawing was help, and there was no winner (but the acting secretary neglected to note either the amount or the potential winner).

Motion to close the meeting was made by K9JWI at 2115. W9YA seconded and the motion passed.


