After tonight KEYS for the shack will be requested from a club officer and issued by Debbie in the Red Cross office. She will issue the password to be used with the key issued.

Jeff Stewart reminded us that the Feast of the Hunter's Moon will be held this weekend and he still needs more volunteers to help This is a major source of funds for the club and help is badly needed.

Several members are intending to work the contest the last weekend of this month. All are welcome. There is some concern about interference with the PA system in the church next door and Bruce Stewart requests that we avoid Sunday morning hours until he can check with them and check this out.

A coffee can with money has been in one of the filing cabinet drawers for a long and it was decided to deposit this money (\$39.26) into our treasury.

The next program mtg. On Oct 25 will be presented by Ed Delf (on GPS). There will be no program meetings in Nov. or Dec because of the Holidays.

The history i s incomplete as some of the minutes were missing. we may have misnoted a date here and there, but at least it gives some idea of where we came from. +++++++++++++++++




