WB9BRX says that we will have 20-30 tables available for our hamfest use. Thanks to the folks at the fairgrounds for the temporary loan. In case you are wondering, the building we rent is not normally supplied with tables. The groundskeeper has gone out of his way to provide them in the past (at no additional cost to us), and has agreed to do so again this year. Tables are not always available, depending on other activities at the fairgrounds.

By general agreement, the club's Yaesu FT726 will once again be put up for sale. In order to give all club members a fair chance to purchase this equipment, bids will be accepted at the next regular business meeting (September 9, 2003). Purchase price is \$400 or best offer.

General description: The rig is an early satellite capable radio. The rig is really a chassis which accommodates up to three modules. Each module supports one VHF or UHF band. The rig is equipped with three modules, one each for 6m, 2m and 440MHz. Each band is fully SSB, FM and CW capable and puts out about 10 watts. There is no CTCSS tone encoder, but the rig is otherwise usable on repeater frequencies (requires both Rx and Tx frequencies be individually programmed). Original manual and hand mic included.

Although no specific bidding process was discussed, the Secretary is volunteering to accept bids on behalf of club members who cannot attend the September meeting. Send email to <a href="mailto:n9lf@arrl.net">n9lf@arrl.net</a> with your name and bid. I will hold all bids and present them at the meeting.

Treasurer Keith Marshall, AB8BD reported a checking account balance of \$2018.19. He also reported Hamvention income through June 1 of \$51,933.50, and expenses paid of \$49,964.99. Overall, he reported that Hamvention had about \$548,000 income.

Hamvention Chair Ray Neff, N8IGS reported that he believes there are outstanding bills of about \$15,000, and unreceived income of about \$20,000. Per Garry Mathews, as of May 27, expenses were \$570.420, and income was \$568,080. He also reported outstanding income of \$33,166, and outstanding payables of about \$21,900. It was noted that at the Planning Council meeting a few days earlier, the report indicated an expected overall loss on the show of about \$20,000. It was also noted that the budget submitted to the board at mid-year indicated expenses and income in the range of \$850,000. No plausible explanation for this \$300,000 difference was given. The Hamvention General Chairman, the Treasurer, and Garry Matthews begged off on any further reporting until the required report date in September. Several board members felt this was unacceptable, and too late to be useful to the Board in dealing with immediate financial problems. Further, it was noted that the numbers being reported had very little credibility since they seemed to change over the course of an hour's discussion and questioning.

Senior Trustee Dave Coons, WT8W reported for Planning Council on the investigation into financial transactions dating back as far as 1992. He noted that "things were purchased, but went elsewhere", and that there were "irresponsible fiscal practices." Unfortunately, he noted, there is no smoking gun that points to any single person or activity. It was left up to the incoming Board to determine

where this should go next.

Planning Council also reported on their review of the 2003 Hamvention, which showed an expected loss of about \$20,000. A motion to "cancel Hamvention for 2004 and beyond due to failure to provide a suitable return" was made by Secretary Tom Holmes, N8ZM, and seconded by Junior Trustee Greg Hoskins, N8TED. The motion failed 2-4-1.

The Special Event station to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Cass County Radio Club is set to operate from the EMA building on SR17, 2 miles North of Logansport.

Records show that the first club meeting took place in May of 1953.

The station, W9V, plans to operate on the following frequencies: 7250 kHz, 14,280 kHz, and 146.52 mHz. The club repeater on 147.18 mHz will also be used.

Depending upon conditions and interference, the HF choices may be shifted slightly.

Certificate will be provided free to anyone contacting W9V who makes a request.

W9V to operate around noon to 6PM, Saturday, October 18.

One or two stations will operate, depending upon conditions and operators.
