Meeting notes from the North Central Indiana Hamfest Committee Saturday Dec 3, 2005 10:00 am -- 12:30 pm

On Saturday, Dec 3, a group of amateur radio operators met at the Miami County EMA office to discuss the possibility of sponsoring a hamfest that would take place in March-April of each year, and be located in the north central Indiana area. The idea for this meeting originated in part from low attendance at several local hamfests and the idea that perhaps one regional hamfest would draw larger crowds, be more attractive to commercial vendors, and allow local clubs to pool their resources for hamfest activities. After having informal discussions with several amateurs in the region, it was felt that there was support for such an activity, and so the meeting was scheduled.

At this point it should be recognized that the people in attendance were not there as official representatives of their radio clubs. We met merely as interested hams that have been involved in local hamfests. It is our intent to take the results of this meeting back to our respective clubs and seek their support and endorsement for our plan.

Nick Nickerson, K9NQW, opened the meeting with introductions. Hams from Peru, Lafayette, Marion, Kokomo, Hartford City, Wabash, and Logansport were present. A list of attendees can be found at the end of this memo. A general discussion about our purpose was held with general agreement that one centrally located regional hamfest would likely be better than several smaller, local hamfests. We discussed possible locations and times for a regional

hamfest and agreed that Peru would be a central location and the Miami County Fairgrounds a suitable site. We next discussed what time of the year would be best for the hamfest. It was generally felt that early spring would be good. The former Southbend hamfest is being moved to Goshen and will be held in October. Ft. Wayne is held the third week of November. The Dayton hamfest is the third week of May. Based on this we felt late March or early April would be good.

There was additional general discussion about the idea, and benefits that a successful regional hamfest would bring to the north central Indiana amateur radio community. At this point there was unanimous support for going forward with our idea. We have tentatively agreed to form a committee to sponsor a hamfest to be held Saturday, April 1, 2006 at the Miami County fairgrounds. The hamfest will be called the North Central Indiana Hamfest.

Our next task will be to confirm availability of the fairgrounds. Backup dates are April 8th, and March 25th. **Greg Dean** will head the Vendor Committee and Communications/Public Relations Committee. **Linda and Robbie Robinson** will be the Facilities Committee. **Nick Nickerson** will chair the ARRL liaison and Website Committee.

Our next meeting will be held at the Miami County EMA offices Saturday, January 7th at 10:00 am. We will be using email and telephone to keep in touch and advise the hamfest committee as tasks are completed.

Purdue News

The Purdue Amateur Radio Club (W9YB) is soliciting donations to replace the existing (and quite obsolete) packet cluster software. All donations are tax deductible. Anyone interested in helping out should contact **Tim Gardner/ N9LF** <u>at n9lf@arrl.net</u> or by telephone at 447-2615. To make sure that all donations get to the right place, all money will be collected and delivered directly in one batch.

W9YB conducts a radio net and repeater test every Monday beginning at 8pm local. The first net is on their 6 meter re-

peater (53.190 - MHz), followed 10 minutes later with a net on the 2 meter machine (146.76 - 88Hz). Finally at 8:20 a third net is conducted on the 444.5MHz + 88Hz repeater. Like the ARES Hamtivity net (Thursday, 7:30pm, 147.1235 + 88Hz), membership or affiliation with the Purdue club is not required. All amateurs are welcome.

Emergency Manager (still) Needed
